National Park Service Awards Biohabitats Contract & Supports Green Jobs Creation

Baltimore, MD- For the second time in three years, [Biohabitats, Inc.](#), the nation's leading [ecological restoration](#), [conservation planning](#), and [regenerative design](#) firm, was selected by the National Park Service to provide [revegetation](#) and restoration planning, implementation and monitoring services through an Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract.
